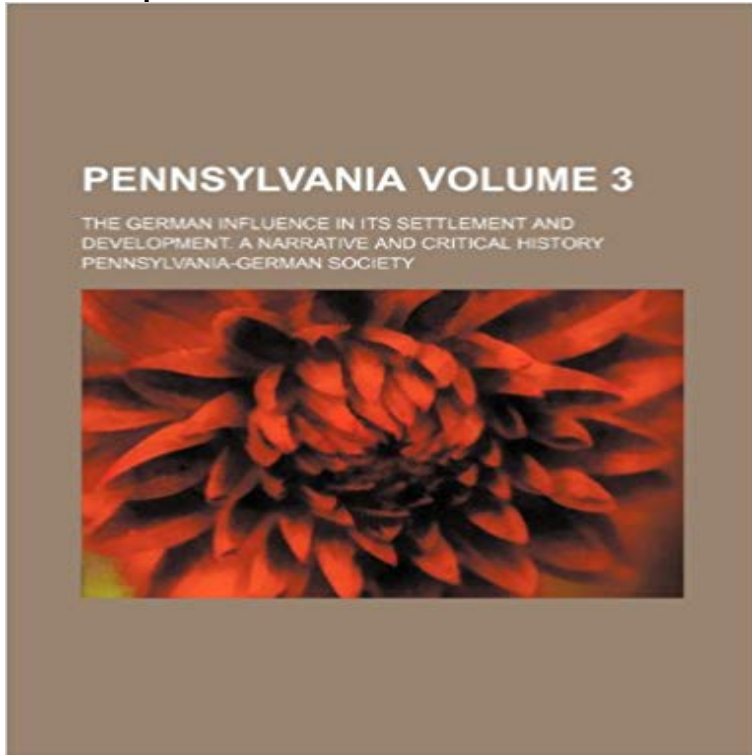


Pennsylvania Volume 3; the German influence in its settlement and development. A narrative and critical history

The smell of powder freshened me up a little, so that in the evening I could, for the first time in the week, eat a bit with an appetite. On July nth, it being the fourth Sunday after Trinity, I held divine service with the Salzburgers, and we greatly refreshed ourselves from the Gospel of Luke 6, so that we were able to rejoice in our Saviour.
