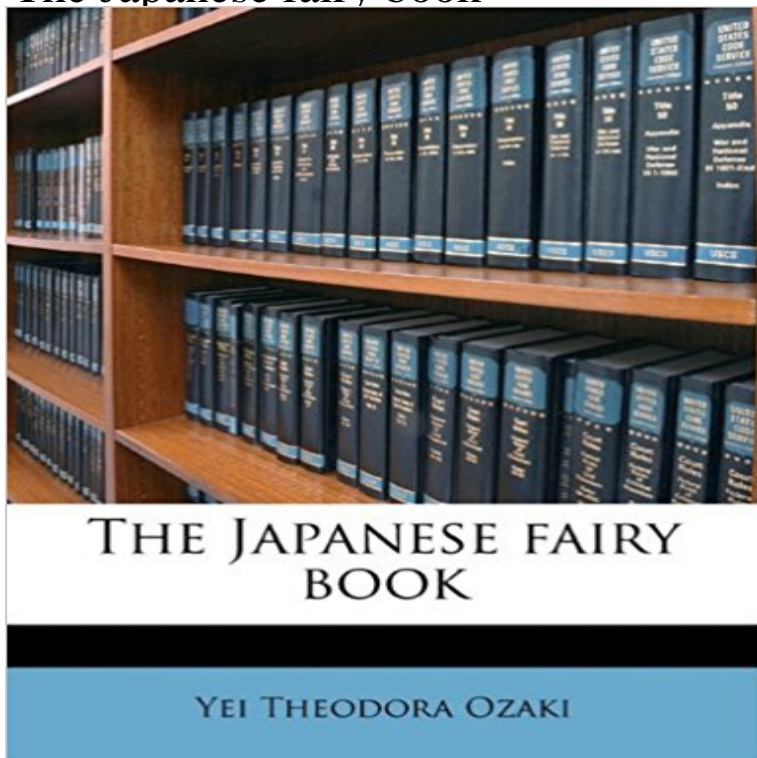


The Japanese fairy book
