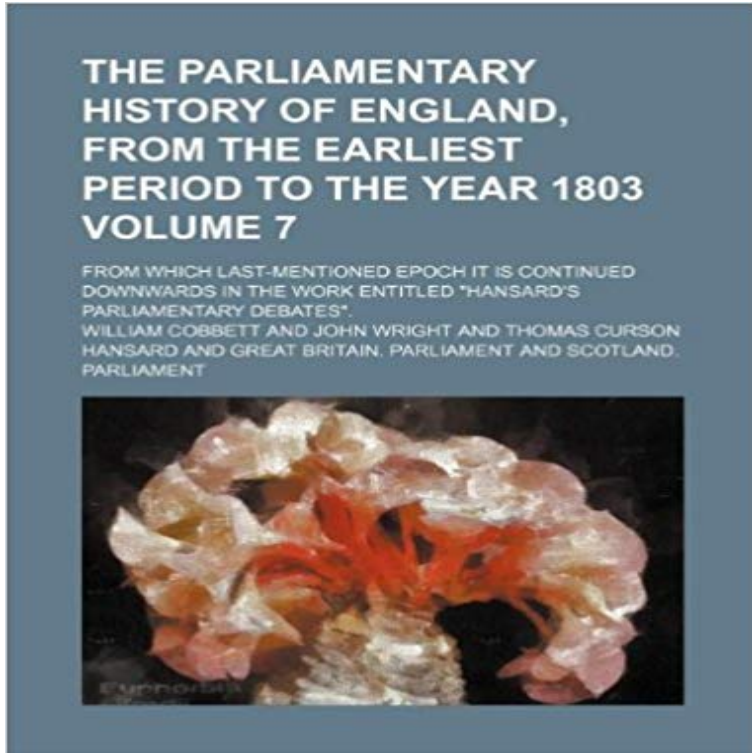

As soon as the King was withdrawn and the Commons were returned to their House, Uk duke of Manchester made a motion for an Address of Thanks and Congratulation to his majesty; and being seconded by the earl of Hoiderness, the same was unanimously agreed to, the archbishop of Canterbury only desiring that a clause might be added to the said Address, to acknowledge his majestys seasonable interposition in favour of t he Protestan ts abroad, which was readily complied with. The Address was as follows: Most Gracious Sovereign: We, your mnjestys most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Lords Spiritual and Temporal in parliament assembled, beg leave to congratulate your majesty, on your safe and bnppy return to this kingdom, and upon the irnvt success with which it has pleased God to bless the wise measures taken by your rmijesty, to procure and establish peace in Europe.
